

How many energy storage facilities are there in the Netherlands?

The vast majority of the 20 MW of installed energy storage capacity in the Netherlands is spread over just three facilities: the Netherlands Advancion Energy Storage Array (10 MW Li-ion), the Amsterdam ArenA (4 MW Li-ion), and the Bonaire Wind-Diesel Hybrid project (3 MW Ni-Cad battery).

Why is energy storage important in the Netherlands?

Energy storage can play a key role in contributing to solutions for shortages of capacity on the grid. It is therefore no surprise that we have seen the appetite for large-scale battery energy storage systems growing in the Netherlands.

Are batteries a barrier to energy storage in the Netherlands?

Under the Electricity Act 1998, generation is exempt from the payment of transmission costs, but consumption is not. This highlights one of the main barriers to energy storage in the Netherlands, as batteries currently pay more transmission costs than polluting wholesale consumers.

Where are energy storage systems located?

Usually, energy storage systems are located on plots of land owned by parties other than the developer. In these cases, it is essential that the developers obtain the appropriate land rights and these rights will typically include a right of superficies (see below) and will in general have a duration of 20 to 30 years.

GIGA Buffalo, the largest battery energy storage system in the Netherlands provided by technology group Wärtsilä, has been officially inaugurated after 10 months of construction. The ribbon-cutting ceremony last week (6 October) marks the opening of the 24MW/48MWh project, which uses Wärtsilä's grid-scale energy storage product Gridsolv ...

Construction is expected to begin in the third quarter of this year and testing will commence in Q2 2022. With the global market for energy storage expected to grow rapidly in the coming years, the laboratory will aim to stimulate safe development of battery systems, offering design evaluation services as well as fire propagation and fire suppression testing.

Developer-operator SemperPower has brought online its second large-scale BESS in the Netherlands in the space of a month, a 68MWh system, the largest in the country. The company has energised the 30MW/68MWh "Pollux" battery energy storage system (BESS) project, it announced today (20 December).

The deal has been agreed for Giga's 300MW/1,200MWh Leopard project in Vlissingen, northern Netherlands, on which construction should start this year, as told to Energy-Storage.news by the firm's CCO Lars Rupert in June. The time limited contract becomes active on 1 October, 2025, although Giga has previously said Leopard would come online in 2026.
