

What should young Cook Islands Mori men do to promote health?

We recommend that health promotion for Young Cook Islands M?ori men living in the Cook Islands focus on: Providing healthy eating and fitness programmes within the community, including workshops suitable for young men.

How does SPC support young people in the Cook Islands?

Hon. Mokoroa acknowledged SPC's support towards the youth and the Government of Cook Islands which enabled the completion of the policy. "I acknowledge the substantial technical and financial support by the SPC in producing this work for the development of our young people," Hon. Mokoroa highlighted.

What does Hon Mokoroa say about youth in Cook Islands?

Hon. Mokoroa during the launch acknowledged the youth of Cook Islands for their contribution to society and highlighted the importance of their development in all areas. "I personally advocate for the development of youth in all areas including sports, the church, education, business, environment, culture and even politics.

How old are Cook Islands men?

The aged ranged from 16 to 80 plus years. Many of the Cook Islands M?ori men identified being a Cook Islands M?ori man were strongly linked to their cultural practices, such as having a sense of connection to land ownership. The men's definition of health is physically fit and eating healthy foods.

How many people live in the Cook Islands?

The Cook Islands population is the third-largest Pacific population in New Zealand, with around 80,500 members, half of whom are men, and whose median age is 21 years. About eight out of ten were born in New Zealand (83%).

What are the key health priorities in the Cook Islands?

One of the key priorities was to support better health outcomes for young people. The government is the main provider of health care, including primary care and public health programmes (Te Marae Ora Cook Islands Ministry of Health, 2015); it is located on the island of Rarotonga and also provides services for the outer islands.
