

What is the role of the EU in Africa's energy sector?

The EU is the main ODA donor for the energy sector in Africa, with a long-term strategy as well as a variety of instruments for financing new projects and promoting structural reforms.

What is the Africa-EU Green Energy Initiative?

The projects underway since 2021 are part of the Africa-EU Green Energy Initiative, which aims to support the deployment of at least 50 GW of renewable electricity, providing more than 100 million people with access to electricity (European Commission, 2022).

What is the European Commission doing with Namibia & Egypt?

In November 2022, the European Commission signed two Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) for strategic renewable hydrogen partnerships with Namibia and Egypt.

Which countries are represented in the Central African Republic?

France is the only Member State represented in the Central African Republic, but Italy, Germany, Denmark, the Netherlands, the United Kingdom, Sweden, Luxembourg and Ireland are also involved, either as technical and financial partners, through NGOs or through contributions to the Boukoko Trust Fund (since 2014).

The Central African Republic had a population of 4.7 million people in 2013 (World Bank, 2015). Electricity production in 2015 was 18 ktoe with 88.8 per cent of it generated from hydro. Final electricity consumption in 2015 was 15 ktoe (AFREC, 2015).
